Day 1

Salta - Cuesta del Obispo - Molinos - Colomé

Distance: 122 km paved road. 106 km gravel road. Altitude: Highest point 3.457 m./11.342 feet. Colomé 2.300 m./7.546 feet. Estimated driving time: 5 hs.

Mesmerizing journey along the breathtaking road from Salta to Colomé, a route that unveils the diverse beauty of the Argentinean Northwest. Traverse through four distinct ecosystems, from the lush greenery of the Yungas jungle to the semi-deserted expanse of the Calchaquí Valley. Over 33 kilometers of mountainous terrain, you'll ascend to Paso Piedra de Molino, standing at an elevation of 3,457 meters. Witness the majestic flight of Condors against the azure sky, encounter guanacos and wild burros amidst a sea of cardones, the region's giant cacti. As day turns to night, retire to the enchanting Estancia Colomé nestled in the Calchaquí Valleys. This historical haven is not only one of Argentina's incredible places but also home to the country's oldest winery. Immerse yourself in the colonial estate's rich past, where stories and mysteries come to life. Indulge in unique wines and savor regional cuisine crafted from local ingredients sourced from their garden and agroecological farm. Explore Colomé's natural wonders, relish its landscapes, and surrender to the enchanting silence that makes this experience truly magical.

Day 2

Colomé - Quebrada de las Flechas - Cafayate

Distance: 52 km paved road. 20 km gravel road. Altitude: Highest point 2.300 m./7.546 feet. Cafayate 1.683 m./5.522 feet. Estimated driving time: 3 hs.

The RN40 continues and crosses the Quebrada de las Flechas Scenic Route, with formations that seem from another planet. In San Carlos and Cafayate you can enjoy the view of the Calchaquí River and do experiential tourism in rural communities that includes, among other activities: agrotourism, walks, horseback riding, regional cooking classes, wine making, and ceramic crafts. This entire region is part of the Wine Route (one of the highest in the world), with wineries, vineyards and wine tourism experiences. We will arrive in Cafayate to enjoy the amazing landscapes, rock formations and cultural heritage. At Sunset, we recommend an optional photo safari to Quebrada de las Conchas or to the sand dunes.

Day 3 Cafayate - Ruinas de Quilmes - Quebrada de las Conchas - Salta Distance: 286 km paved road.

Altitude: Highest point 1.850 m./ 6.070 feet. Salta 1.200 m. / 3.937 feet. Estimated driving time: 5 hs.

In the morning, under the best light, we will visit the renowned pre-Inca ruins, Sacred City of Quilmes. This fascinating site offers ample time for an immersive walk through its ancient structures, allowing you to connect deeply with the region's rich history. It is one of the main archaeological sites in Argentina. Walking amid the city's stone walls, ceremonial sites and teasels is an unforgettable experience. On our return journey to Salta, we will traverse the stunning Quebrada de las Conchas Canyon, a Natural Heritage Site characterized by striking red formations. These formations, dating back to the Mesozoic and Cenozoic eras (90 to 60 million years), owe their vibrant color to the ferric oxide in their mineral deposits. The gorge derives its name from the marine fossils found in the region's oldest geological formation, known as the "Formación Yacoraite." As the day winds down, we will settle in for the night at the serene Finca Valentina, offering a perfect end to a day filled with exploration and discovery.

Day 4

Salta - Quebrada del Toro - San Antonio de los Cobres - Salinas Grandes - Purmamarca Distance: 142 km paved road. 179 km gravel road. Altitude: Highest point 4.170 m./13.681 feet. Purmamarca 2.192 m./7.192 feet. Estimated driving time: 6 hs.

Journey through the Toro's Gorge, a natural gateway that connects the verdant Lerma Valley of Salta, renowned for its lush tobacco fields and majestic horses, to the arid plateau of the Puna at over 3,500 meters above sea level. In less than 100 kilometers, we follow the historic path of the Train to the Clouds, crossing the eastern chain of the Andes into the heart of the Puna. Along the way, we'll visit El Mojón, a small, resilient settlement that exemplifies the enduring spirit of the Andean inhabitants, who harmoniously blend modern life with ancestral traditions.

Our adventure continues to the vast expanse of Salinas Grandes, a dazzling white salt flat stretching over 100 kilometers, framed by towering volcanoes and offering an endless horizon. As we ascend to the highest point of our journey, we are rewarded with unparalleled views of the Eastern Andean Range before descending the winding Cuesta de Lipán.

As sunset, we arrive at the enchanting village of Purmamarca, nestled at the foot of the mesmerizing Cerro de los Siete Colores. Here, the vibrant hues of the mountain and the village's timeless charm invite you to immerse yourself in the serene beauty and rich culture of this unique region..

Day 5

Purmamarca - Tilcara - Uquía - Serranías del Hornocal - Iruya

Distance: 93 km paved road, 119 km gravel road. Altitude: Highest point 4.300 m./13123 feet. Iruya 2.780 m./9.121 feet. Estimated driving time: 5 hs.

Embark on a unique adventure through the Humahuaca Gorge, a vast valley in the far north of Argentina's Jujuy province that stretches to the Bolivian border. Formed a mere million years ago, this young valley is renowned for its vibrant, colorful mountains, dramatic geological formations, and historic villages. Our journey will immerse you in the region's rich cultural tapestry, visiting highlights such as the bustling Humahuaca Market. We'll explore the charming villages of Tilcara, Humahuaca, and Purmamarca that offer unique artisanal markets, perfect for discovering local crafts. We'll also venture to the stunning Serranías del Hornocal, famed for its breathtakingly colorful mountains and unparalleled photo opportunities. After exploring Humahuaca, we'll take a scenic secondary gravel road to the Condor Pass at 4,000 meters, offering spectacular views of the Cordillera Oriental. Our day culminates in the remote mountain village of Iruya, where time seems to stand still. Here, surrounded by the timeless beauty of the Andes and its ancient culture, we'll spend the night, experiencing a truly authentic adventure in remote Argentina.

Day 6

Iruya - Uquía - Yungas Forest - Salta

Distance: 260 km paved road. 50 km gravel road. Altitude: Highest point 4.000 m./13123 feet. Salta 1.200 m./3.937 feet Estimated driving time: 6 hs.

Explore the eastern side of the Iruya Valley, where you'll discover even smaller, charming villages nestled under the majestic Cerro Morado. Amid the mountains and surrounded by an impressive landscape, the architecture in Iruya reflects its pre-Columbian origins, offering great cultural and historical value. From the Mirador de Iruya viewpoint, you can see the entire town and its breathtaking surroundings. For the more adventurous, the Mirador del Cóndor is accessible via an intermediate-difficulty trail, providing spectacular views of the surrounding mountains and valleys.

As we return to the Quebrada de Humahuaca, we'll visit the small town of Uquía, famous for its paintings of the 17th century, an artistic treasure exhibited at San Francisco de Padua Church. Our journey continues along Route 9, a winding road that meanders through the lush jungle of the Yungas, unthought extension of the Amazonian massif in the barren geography of the northwest. Finally, we will make our way back to the vibrant city of Salta, concluding our authentic adventure with memories of Argentina's diverse landscapes, rich traditions, and the timeless beauty of the Andes.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION

HIGH ALTITUDE TRIPS

Because of its altitude (average 3,500 / 3,700 metres above sea level) the Puna is in contact with rare layers of the atmosphere. When the share of gas in the air changes, the human body



manages the new environmental situation, compensating the lower presence of oxygen with a rapid breathing, to provide more air into the lungs, and a faster heart rate to pump more blood and oxygenate more. All of this can cause some agitation and a feeling of lack of oxygen. In addition, the altitude causes a substantial difference in air pressure. A person at sea level is below a column of air equivalent to a difference of almost 4,000 metres with respect to the same person in the Puna.

Therefore, these conditions require special attention during our trips, when spending one or more nights in the Puna. It is particularly important:

TRAVEL TIPS

- Drink at least two litres of water per day.
- Protect yourself from the sun/UV radiation with a hat, sunblock and sunglasses.
- Do not consume tap water.
- Travel with your own medication and bring extra doses.
- Respect the local cultures and wildlife.
- Keep your eating habits; avoid eating or drinking in excess, before and during the journey.
- Important: follow instructions from our guide.



PASSENGER INFORMATION FORM

All passengers must fill in the Information Form and it is compulsory for them to inform about health conditions and/or any other relevant information regarding health. The form must be sent through email before the departure date.



- Pick up 4WD vehicles equipped for overlanding trips.
- Professional guide/driver.
- National Permit for passenger's transportation.
- Insurance for transported passengers and drivers.
- Water (1 ¹/₂ litres per day per person) and snacks on board.



- Special equipment for overland trips (first aid kit, satellite communication, extra tools, fuel and extra tyre).
- Oxygen tube.
- 24/7 Logistics support from the Salta office with daily monitoring.

CANCELLATION POLICY

- 1. Cancellation 7 days before departure: 100% penalty for services provided directly by Socompa. As for the accommodation and rent a car services, the penalty amount will be informed according to the cancellation policy of each local supplier.
- 2. Cancellation 15 days to 8 days before departure: 50% penalty for services provided directly by Socompa. As for the accommodation and rent a car services, the penalty amount will be informed according to the cancellation policy of each local supplier.
- 3. Cancellation 16 days or more before departure: 25% penalty for services provided directly by Socompa. As for the accommodation and rent a car services, the penalty amount will be informed according to the cancellation policy of each local supplier.

Important: VAT Refund benefit will not be applicable in case of cancellation or no-show fees and charges. If cancellation is subject to charges, the VAT tax will be calculated and invoiced at the time of receiving the cancellation.

VAT REFUND REGULATIONS (APPLIES TO ACCOMMODATION AND BREAKFAST ONLY)

- 1. This quote is only valid if guests are eligible for the VAT reimbursement benefit.
- 2. The VAT Refund benefit is exclusive for foreign visitors with proven residence outside Argentina. A copy of each passport is required to confirm reservations. If the country of residence is different from the country of citizenship, please confirm details by email. Bookings with no passports provided will be re-quoted to add the applicable VAT rate.
- 3. When passports are not provided at time of booking, the accommodations with breakfast will be re-quoted to include applicable VAT (currently 21 %) to be collected with payment.
- 4. VAT Refund applies only to accommodation and breakfast (if included in the room rate). Other services provided by the hotel are excluded from the VAT Refund policy.
- 5. VAT Refund will not be applicable in the event of cancellation fees or no-show's charges.

CANCELLATION POLICY FOR HOTEL BOOKINGS

The deadline for Hotel Bookings is subject to the policies of each Hotel. In General, the deadline to hold rooms without penalty fee ranges between 60 and 30 days prior to arrival. For this contingency, many hotels are applying a flexible cancellation policy and we will inform the details with each booking.



For VAT refund purposes, a scan of each participant's Passport is required to be sent at least 25 days prior to arrival date. Such Passports must be valid for at least 6 months since the arrival date.
