TOUR BY DAY

DAY 1

Salta - Cuesta del Obispo - Cachi - Molinos (L)

Distance: 122 km paved road. 81 km earth track and gravel road.

Altitude: Highest point 3.457 m./ 11.342 feet. Molinos 2.020 m. / 6.627 feet.

Estimated driving time: 4 hs.

The road between Salta and Molinos is one of the most spectacular paths of the Argentinean Northwest. We will travel through four different ecosystems, from the green *yungas* forest (jungle) to the arid desert of the Calchaquí Valley. We take Route 33 for 33 km until we arrive at the highest point in our journey on the *Cuesta del Obispo*, called Paso Piedra del Molino, 3.457 meters above sea level. You may observe condors flying in the blue sky among thousands of *cardones*, the local species of giant cactus. We arrive at the white colonial village of Cachi, where the sun shines almost all year round, and where you can relax under a cosy *molle* tree. Leaving Cachi, we take the mystical Route 40 - which connects all of Argentina North to South. We will spend the night in the historical hotel, *Hacienda de Molinos*. This homestead once belonged to the colonial governors established by the Spanish crown in the late 18th century. One of the oldest and largest *molle* trees in the area is located in the middle of the property.

DAY 2

Molinos - Quebrada de las Flechas - Cafayate - Quebrada de las Conchas - Cafayate (B/L)

Distance: 100 km paved road. 115 km gravel road.

Altitude: Highest point 2.300 m./7.546 feet. Cafayate 1.683 m./5.522 feet

Estimated driving time: 5 hs.



Route 40 is one of the most famous and longest roads in the world. Originating in the southernmost tip of Argentina, Punta Loyola, Santa Cruz, one can travel over 5.000 km to the northernmost town, La Quiaca, Jujuy. Between the towns of Molinos and Cafayate there are many little villages populated by local winemakers and farmers. We drive across the *Quebrada de las Flechas*, a desert formed by dust of limestone and quartz, eroded by wind and water, creating the shape of thousands of Arrowhead Peaks. We arrive in Cafayate, which is the perfect place for lunch and to visit a winery. Just before the sunset with the best lighting of the day, we explore the *Quebrada de las Conchas*, a deep ravine formed millions of years ago full of ancient fossils. It contains huge deposits of clay and sandstone, molded by water and wind that comes from an age when the region was dominated by a humid and warm climate.

DAY 3

Cafayate - Quilmes - Hualfin - Cuesta de Randolfo - El Peñón (B/L/D)

Distance: 250 km paved road, 50 km gravel road

Altitude: Highest point 4.050 m./13.287 feet. El Peñón 3.400 m./11.155 feet.

Estimated driving time: 5 hs.

Continuing south on Route 40, we will explore one of the most deserted regions of Argentina. In the morning, we visit the sacred Ruins of Quilmes and the *Museo de Interpretación*, which displays the dramatic history and exile of this powerful Pre-Columbian population. After a few hours, we continue our journey and begin climbing the *Cuesta de Randolfo* until we reach the high altitude desert plateau, called the *Puna*. Between groups of *vicuñas*, giant white sand dunes, volcanos and lagoons, we will reach the sparsely-populated town, El Peñón, at 3,400 meters above sea level. It is one of the last remaining authentic *Puna* villages, with adobe houses where shepherds tend to their flocks of llamas, goats, and sheep. We spend the night at the cozy Hostería de Altura de El Peñón.

DAY 4

El Peñon - Volcán & Laguna Carachi Pampa - Campo Piedra Pomez - Dunas Blancas - El Peñon (B/L/D)

Distance: 130 km of earth, gravel and salt tracks.

Altitude: Highest point 4.200 m./13.780 feet. El Peñón 3.400 m./11.155 feet.

Estimated driving time: 4:30 hs.

On this day, we work our way deeper into the remote vastness of the Andean *Puna*. Here you will see some of the highest peaks of the Andes. Our adventure begins with a stop at the Carachi Pampa lagoon at the base of the Volcano that shares the same name. One of the most notable characteristics of the landscape here is the contrast of colors between the midnight-black volcano, azure sky, and vermilion lagoon. The most famous inhabitants of this lagoon are the flamingos, which can be seen throughout the year, especially in the warm seasons. Here, we take some time to wander the sites and enjoy the surroundings on foot.

Later, our journey will continue into the Natural Reserve Campo de Piedra Pómez, a strange and stunning landscape carved into the rock that gives rise to its name: The Pumice stone field. The wave-like towers were formed by an ancient volcanic pyroclastic cloud, boasts a distinctive ivory-orange color, powdery characteristics and is easily sculpted by the arid and harsh winds of the Andean region. Adjacent to Campo de Piedra Pómez, we will make our way a few miles to the west and climb the impressive dunas blancas - white sand dunes, before returning to the hotel, just in time to enjoy the stunning sunset views from the village

DAY 5

El Peñón - Antofagasta de la Sierra - Quebrada de Calalaste - Vega Colorada - Oasis Antofalla & Antofallita - Cono de Arita - Tolar Grande (B/L/D)

Distance: 340 km earth track and salt road.

Altitude: Highest point 4.500 m./14.764 feet. Tolar Grande 3.500 m./11.483 feet..

Estimated driving time: 7 hs.

Leaving El Peñón, we pass through Antofagasta de la Sierra, a large oasis that once connected the Argentinean side of the Andes to San Pedro de Atacama, Chile, as part of the Inca Trail. It



remains the largest settlement in the Puna region, with more than 2.000 people who still maintain their ancient traditions and culture. We continue our ascent through the gorge of Calalaste, reaching a maximum altitude of 4.667 meters, from which we descend into Vega Colorada. It is the only place with fresh spring water, and is a hotspot for wildlife, including *vicuñas*, llamas, donkeys, *suris* (small Andean ostriches), and if we are lucky, Andean pumas. We stop briefly at the lookout point, which boasts a 180° view of the Antofalla salt flat (the longest in Argentina) and its countless surrounding volcano peaks. The settlement of Antofalla is still inhabited by a tiny community of 60 people, a majority of whom are shepherds. As we continue our journey, we reach the *Salar de Arizaro* - one of the largest salt flats in the world. We stop at the eastern border to marvel at the mysterious *Cono de Arita*, a natural cone-shaped geologic formation, seemingly in the middle of nowhere. We traverse the salt flat, and we arrive at the small mining town, Tolar Grande, surrounded by bright red mountains where we turn in for the evening.

DAY 6

Tolar Grande - Desierto del Laberinto - San Antonio de los Cobres (B/L/D)

Distance: 65 km paved road. 180 km earth track and gravel road

Altitude: Highest point 4.500 m./14.764 feet. San Antonio de los Cobres 3700 mts

Estimated driving time: 4 hs.

The morning will be dedicated to the exploration of the surroundings of Tolar Grande, which offer chances of spectacular, short hikes, the best one being to the Hidden Sand Dune in the middle of the desert. From the top of the dune, travelers will be rewarded with a 360° view of the area, from the Sacred Macon Mountain to the west, to the Llullaillaco Volcano to the east. (In 1999, a National Geographic team discovered 3 Inca children mummified by the climatic conditions at Llullaillaco, which can be seen at the MAAM Museum in Salta.)

We take a short drive to Ojos de Mar, small salt formations filled with water containing ancient colonies of stromatolite bacteria, which give the little lakes their distinct aquamarine color.



We continue our journey, crossing the Labyrinth Desert, a 10 million-year-old dune desert formed by many small clay peaks, dusted with gypsum crystals. The highest point of our drive this day will be Abra Chorrillos, reaching over 4.500 m, and there we will learn about the *Apacheta* and its cultural importance to the Andean culture. Finally, we arrive at San Antonio de los Cobres, a quiet, dusty village where the famous Tren a las Nubes begins its journey. It is one of the highest towns in Argentina, with one of the largest populations in the Puna region.*

DAY 7

San Antonio de los Cobres - Sey - Susques - Salinas Grandes - Purmamarca (B/L)

Distance: 140 km paved road. 120 km earth track and gravel road

Altitude: Highest point 4.500 m./14.764 feet. Purmamarca 2.192 m./7.192 feet

Estimated driving time: 6 Hs.

In the morning, we leave San Antonio de los Cobres and continue climbing in altitude to Susques. Our first stop will be the Viaducto la Polvorilla, one of the tallest and longest bridges built above sea level, an iron and steel structure built in the beginning of the 20th century, still to this day considered to be an impressive feat of engineering, made famous by the Tren a las Nubes. We continue along the famous Route 40, which connects Argentina from north to south, stopping at La Juguetería - a fascinating rock formation formed by a volcanic eruption which ejected massive rocks, landing on barren land. Some say that these rocks look like dice thrown onto a gaming board, hence the name "La Juguetería" (the place of games).

We usually stop for lunch in Susques, a historic town with pre-colonial roots, and we continue to Salinas Grandes, arguably the whitest salt flats you can find in Argentina. With more than 212 km² of salt surrounded by volcanoes, the horizon seems endless. Here we stop to appreciate the salt pools and take photos that play with perspective.

Finally, crossing the highest point of the itinerary, we will enjoy the best view on the Eastern Cordillera of the Andes going down the Cuesta de Lipan. At sunset, we will arrive at the Andean village of Purmamarca, famous for its Cerro de Siete Colores.

DAY 8

Purmamarca - Humahuaca - Hornocal - Tilcara - Salta (B/L)

Distance: 320 km paved road, 70 km gravel road.

Altitude: Highest point 4.300 m./14.108 feet. Salta 1.200 m./3.937 feet.

Estimated driving time: 6 hs.

The Humahuaca Gorge is a large valley that ends at the border with Bolivia and it is located in the province of Jujuy in the far north of Argentina. It is quite a young Valley, given that its formation dates a million years. The Gorge is famous for its colorful mountains, its geological formations and its historical villages. During our trip we will visit the best places in the region in order to get a true feeling of this part of Argentina: the Humahuaca Market, a walk in the Colorado's Gorge, the sacred garden of the Cardones (cactus species) at 3200 meters, and the impressive 14 coloured mountains of Hornocal and the Pucara of Tilcara – a pre-Inca fortress. We will also visit the villages of Tilcara, Humahuaca and Purmamarca with their typical artisanal markets. In the afternoon we will return to Salta.

Included meals: lunch in a local restaurant.

Notes in regards to accommodation

- 1. Breakfast is included in every hotel, except Casa Andina (Tolar Grande); in this case it will be served in a local restaurant or our guide will prepare breakfast.
- 2. Accommodation in Standard Category, upgrade can be quoted upon request.
- Accommodation in these properties is subject to availability. If there is no availability, we will suggest options of the same category.
- 4. As an alternative, if there is no availability in Casa Andina (only hotel in town), there are Family Homes that receive guests and there is also a Refuge with shared bedrooms.

Notes in regards to included meals:

- 1. Soft drinks are included with every meal.
- 2. In the Puna the provision of supplies is limited, so the meals are mostly based on local products.
- 3. Please be patient with the timing for the services.



IMPORTANT INFORMATION

HIGH ALTITUDE TRIPS

Because of its altitude (average 3,500 / 3,700 metres above sea level) the Puna is in contact with rare layers of the atmosphere. When the share of gas in the air changes, the human body manages the new environmental situation, compensating the lower presence of oxygen with a rapid breathing, to provide



more air into the lungs, and a faster heart rate to pump more blood and oxygenate more. All of this can cause some agitation and a feeling of lack of oxygen. In addition, the altitude causes a substantial difference in air pressure. A person at sea level is below a column of air equivalent to a difference of almost 4,000 metres with respect to the same person in the Puna.

Therefore, these conditions require special attention during our trips, when spending one or more nights in the Puna. It is particularly important:

TRAVEL TIPS

- Travel to the Puna only after a period of rest in Salta (one day is fine), and avoid travelling under physical or mental fatigue.
- Drink at least two litres of water per day.
- Protect yourself from the sun/UV radiation with a hat, sunblock and sunglasses.
- Do not consume tap water.
- Travel with your own medication and bring extra doses.
- Respect the local cultures and wildlife.
- Keep your eating habits; avoid eating or drinking in excess, before and during the journey.
- Important: follow instructions from our guide.
- Our trips with an itinerary of one or more nights in Puna are exclusively unadvised to people with cardiovascular problems and people with high / low blood pressure.



PASSENGER INFORMATION FORM

• All passengers must fill in the Information Form and it is compulsory for them to inform about health conditions and/or any other relevant information regarding health. The form must be sent through email before the departure date.

CANCELLATION POLICY

- 2. Cancellation 15 days to 8 days before departure: 50% penalty for services provided directly by Socompa. As for the accommodation and rent a car services, the penalty amount will be informed according to the cancellation policy of each local supplier.
- 3. Cancellation 16 days or more before departure: 25% penalty for services provided directly by Socompa. As for the accommodation and rent a car services, the penalty amount will be informed according to the cancellation policy of each local supplier.

If the country of residence is different from the country of citizenship, please confirm details by email. Bookings with no passports provided will be re-quoted to add the applicable VAT rate.
- 3. When passports are not provided at time of booking, the accommodations with breakfast will be re-quoted to include applicable VAT (currently 21 %) to be collected with payment.
- 4. VAT Refund applies only to accommodation and breakfast (if included in the room rate). Other services provided by the hotel are excluded from the VAT Refund policy.
- 5. VAT Refund will not be applicable in the event of cancellation fees or no-show's charges.

CANCELLATION POLICY FOR HOTEL BOOKINGS

The deadline for Hotel Bookings is subject to the policies of each Hotel. In General, the deadline to hold rooms without penalty fee ranges between 60 and 30 days prior to arrival. For this contingency, many hotels are applying a flexible cancellation policy and we will inform the details with each booking.



For VAT refund purposes, a scan of each participant's Passport is required to be sent at least 25 days prior to arrival date. Such Passports must be valid for at least 6 months since the arrival date.
